Proceedings of 3rd Meeting of RRC held on 24.12.2018 in conference room of HSPCB, C-11, Sector 6, Panchkula for Action Plans for polluted river stretches as per NGT orders dated 20.09.2018 in the matter OA No. 673 of 2018 titled More River Stretches are now critically polluted: CPCB.

The 3rd Meeting of RRC was held on 24.12.2018 in conference room of HSPCB, C-11, Sector 6, Panchkula for finalizing the Action Plans for polluted river stretches as per NGT orders dated 20.09.2018 in the matter OA No. 673 of 2018 titled More River Stretches are now critically polluted: CPCB. The list of participants is enclosed as **Annexure- A**.

Member Secretary, HSPCB briefed about the action plan on river Ghaggar and emphasized that Chairman, Executing Committee has taken up the matter regarding non submission of action plan for River Ghaggar very seriously and the concerned departments should send their action plans by 26.12.2018 so that it could be finalized and got approved from Chief Secretary, Haryana before submitting it to Executing Committee. It was also placed before RRC that the departments of HSIIDC, Panchayats, Health, Agriculture, Irrigation and Forest have not appointed Nodal Officers for River Yamuna and Ghaggar Action Plan. So it was advised that the respective Departments should get the letter issued from the respective HODs.

Thereafter, the agenda was taken one by one and the proceeding are given as under:-

1. Identification of points for untreated discharge.

JP Singh, EE, HSPCB informed that the Irrigation Department has given the points where the effluent is being released into drains/ river. The list along detail has already been sent to Regional Officers for placing it before the SESTF/ DSTF. Now as next step, Regional Officers have to get the quantum of effluent assessed for each point corresponding to different Departments and then obtain action taken report from the respective departments. Simultaneously, the quantum along name of Department should also be informed by SESTF/ STF to Water Cell, HSPCB for taking it up with respective HODs.

Irrigation Department was also requested earlier to give the latitude/ longitude of the points, but the same has not been received for the points of river Ghaggar. The Irrigation Department was again requested to supplement the list with the information of geo coordinates.

(Action by Irrigation Department, GMDA, ULBD and HSPCB)

2. Regular Inspection of common wall of drain no. 6 and 8 at Sonapat

The representative of Irrigation Deptt. informed that they have constructed the cross bund in the Drain No. 8. Hence, there is no possibility of discharge from drain No. 8 to River Yamuna. The Irrigation Department was requested to send the status accordingly with HOD's approval so that same could be informed to the Monitoring Committee. The Regional Officer Sonapat has been advised to get the inspection done and submit his report and also place the matter for information of SESTF also.

(Action by Irrigation Department and RO, HSPCB)

3. Dredging & de-silting of drains in the cities.

EE, HSPCB informed that the Departments of Irrigation, GMDA and ULBD have given a general commitment that the drains are de-silted/ cleaned regularly as and when required. But this may not suffice the requirements of direction of NGT. The names of the drains de-silted in a particular month be given and the drains to be de-silted in coming months may also be indicated. He further informed that NGT directions for uncovering the drains in Gurugram have been conveyed to Regional Officers. The Regional Officers should take up the matter in SESTF and send the ATR for the same by SESTF, it was decided.

(Action by ULBD, GMDA and HSPCB)

4. Providing Sewerage in un-sewered area of unapproved colonies

The ULB Department is yet to submit the action plan for diverting/ tapping of sewage from points of release of untreated discharge. The diversion of sewage from some of the points would be easier and we may divert effluent from such points immediately. The action taken be submitted monthly along quantum of sewage diverted and connected to existing sewers. The action plan be prepared in this manner for each town along Yamuna/ Ghaggar.

5. Action Plan for STPs

It has been noticed that the work for STPs/ Sewerage has been delayed by the construction companies of ULBD and the progress for months of December, 2018 is not as per commitment in PERT Chart provided by ULBD. ULBD was requested to initiate action to bridge the gap as per action plan and to strictly monitor the progress as per their commitment.

It was decided that the progress achieved against each STP be informed by respective Department and SESTF/ DSTF every month. The project activity should not be allowed to be delayed in future and any undesirable scenario should be immediately placed before the State Govt., because the NGT has made it clear that the respective Chief Secretary shall be held responsible for non-compliance of the directions of NGT.

EE, HSPCB also placed before the RRC that Commissioners of MCs at Panipat, Sonapat, Karnal and Faridabad have been written DO letter informing them that CS has directed them to personally visit the STPs in their jurisdiction and submit report. Only Commissioner MC, Panipat has visited the STPs. But there is no comments regarding temporary storage. Rest of the Commissioners have not sent any reports. The Regional Officers have been advised to personally talk to them on this issue.

(Action by PHED, ULBD, GMDA, HSVP and HSPCB)

6. Online Monitoring Devices

All the departments informed that they have already initiated the tender process for installation of Online Monitoring Devices on STPs/ CETPs and shall be completed before the target date i.e. 31.01.2019. It was advised that the process

be monitored closely and action taken should also be submitted before SESTF and STF also.

(Action by HSIIDC, PHED, ULBD, GMDA, HSVP and HSPCB)

7. Ground water

EE, HSPCB informed that the conditions for obtaining permission from CGWA for withdrawal of ground water has to be imposed while granting CTE. The order in this regard shall be issued by the Planning Cell of HSPCB. In the mean time, the Regional Officers should prepare the list of the industries which are already having permission from CGWA along with the quantum permitted to each industry. The ATR should also be placed before the SESTF and STF as the Deputy Commissioner is also an ex-officio authority at District Level for CGWA.

(Action by HSPCB)

8. Plan for e-waste management by HSPCB/ULBD.

The Regional Officers and Waste Management Cell were advised to submit further action taken in the matter.

(Action by HSPCB)

9. Plan for plastic waste management by HSPCB/ULBD.

EE, HSPCB informed that the ULBD has framed a policy for plastic waste management but the action on ground need to be reported. The representative of ULBD reported that plastic waste is being collected in the Municipal Areas and sold to the recyclers. The Regional Officers should also check that the provisions of Plastic Waste Management Rules, 2016 are complied with and the matter should be expedited through SESTF/ STF.

(Action by HSPCB and ULBD)

10. Agriculture Practices:-

The officers of the Agriculture Department did not attend any of the meetings of River Rejuvenation Committee despite prior intimation. The Agriculture Department has to formulate policies on crop diversification and water conserving practices in agriculture, which have not been received yet.

(Action by Agriculture Deptt.)

11. Greenery Development Plan in distt.

EE, HSPCB informed that HSVP has submitted their plan but the corresponding maps have not been given by them. Further, the plans of Forest Department and Urban Local Bodies Department (except for Faridabad) have not been received. The Forest Department informed that they have already sent the same. The MS, HSPCB requested that the copy of the same along map be

supplied again. This matter should also be closely monitored by the SESTF/ STF and monthly report be submitted.

(Action by HSPCB, Forest Department, ULBD and HSVP)

12. Disposal by sewages through tankers by private parties.

EE, HSPCB informed that it has already been submitted in Yamuna Action Plan that the mechanism of MCG shall be implemented in all the MCs of Haryana. The MCG should inform how many tankers have been put in place so far and the quantum of sewage disposed/ treated so far through such a mechanism and whether, the Online Software for this mechanism is working or not. The Urban Local Bodies Department was advised to submit ATR for other MCs.

(Action by ULBD)

13. Area having no plan for installation of STPs/ CETPs.

The representative of HSVP informed that they are already in the process of preparing plan for Sector-25 Part-I, Sector-25, Part-II and Sector-29 Part-I, HSVP Panipat and also for industrial area of Hathin. It was advised that the action plan along with time frame be submitted by HSVP.

There was no clarity between GMDA and HSIIDC on who has to prepare the plan for Sector-37, 18 and IDC. Similarly, the MCF had informed that CETPs to be constructed for Sector-27, A, B, C & D, Sector-24 & 25 at Faridabad by HSIIDC but HSIIDC never reported in their proposed plan.

Further, MCG reported that HSIIDC did not transfer land for STP of 2 MLD at Mohmadpur (Point No. 5 & 6 of plan for Leg-III). It was advised that the matter be resolved by the GMDA, MCF/ ULBD and HSIIDC and convey to RRC at the earliest. The matter may also be placed before the Chief Secretary, Haryana it was decided.

(Action by HSIIDC, GMDA, MCF/ ULBD and HSVP)

15. Organizing Health Camps

EE, HSPCB informed that the Health Department has not yet forwarded the details of Health Camps held so far in the State. Justice Pritam Pal, Chairmanship Executing Committee has noted the fact that Haryana and Punjab have not mentioned the details of any Health Camp and the Himachal State has organized many camps and invited him in the camps as well. It was decided that the Health Department should immediately forward the details of all camps held so far and the proposal for the rest of the year. It shall also invite the Chairman of the Executing Committee for the camps scheduled in the first week of January, 2019. The Officer of Health Department agreed that he shall persuade with the Department for the same and also arrange for a study of the disease profile of the areas along river Yamuna and Ghaggar for detecting the water pollution relates diseases/ disorders.

(Action by Health Department)

16. Treatment of sewages in villages.

The villages have been found discharging into drains leading to River Yamuna and Ghaggar. The Panchayat Department has to submit the time bound Action

Plan to control the pollution. They have to execute the work or get it done through some other Departments.

EE, HSPCB informed that in the meeting held on 21.09.2018 under Chairmanship of Chief Secretary, Haryana, the CEO, GMDA has agreed that the construction work of STP of Dhankot can be done by the GMDA if the land is made available to them. The Officer of Panchayat Department informed that they are having land in village-Dhankot and same shall be made available to GMDA.

Panchayat Department was also advised to prepare the action plan for all the villages of the State which are discharging directly / indirectly into rivers. The list of some of the villages discharging into drains is given as under. However, the Panchayat Department should also get the survey done through its Officers for preparing the plan for control of pollution due to sewage of villages.

The Regional Officers were advised to take up the matter with the concerned Deputy Commissioners immediately. It was also informed that the monthly ATR are being uploaded on the Website of HSPCB.
