

Minutes of 6th meeting of State Level Committee Constituted in compliance of NGT orders OA No. 606 of 2018 dated 16.01.2019 held under the chairmanship of Justice Pritam Pal, Former Judge of Punjab and Haryana High Court at 11:00 AM on 09.07.2019

The 6th Meeting of State Level Committee (SLC) constituted in compliance of Hon'ble NGT's directions in OA No.606/2018 in the matter of 'Compliance of Solid Waste Management Rules, 2016' dated 16.01.2019 was held under the chairmanship of Justice Pritam Pal, Former Judge of Punjab and Haryana High Court (Retd.), at 11:00 AM on 09.07.2019 in Conference room of Directorate of Urban Local Bodies, Sector-4, Panchkula to review the status and progress for implementation of all the Waste Management Rules and compliance of the directions of Hon'ble NGT in the State of Haryana. The list of participants is Annexed as per **Annexure-1**.

At the outset Member Secretary, HSPCB cum Member Secretary of SLC welcomed the Chairperson and Members of the Committee and briefed the agenda items to be taken up for the meeting.

Development & Panchayat Department intimated that tenders in all the 22 Districts covering all the model panchayats as notified are being floated but tender for only 3 districts has been finalised i.e. Gurugram, Bhiwani and Yamunanagar and in remaining districts no bids are received and dates have been further extended. The committee was not satisfied with the Performance of Development & Panchayat Department. Worthy Chairperson directed that higher officials of Rural & Panchayat department should be present from next meeting onward so that necessary decision can be taken during the meeting itself. In pursuant to that it was conveyed to the department that apart from tendering out clusters a separate approach should also be adopted because 100% compliance has to be ensured by the 06.09.2019 as per NGT orders.

Director, ULBD briefly outlined the progress made and actions taken against the decisions taken during the previous meeting and gave the summarised details and activities being performed in the state of Haryana.

- a) There are total 1467 ward in the State
- b) Door to Door Collection is achieved in 96% Wards i.e. 1408 out of 1467 wards and Source segregation has been initiated in 30% Wards which is 428 out of 1467 wards and are performing source segregation.
- c) There are total of 3597 vehicles out of which 1548 are compartmentalised and 1218 are GPS enabled.

- d) About 2500 Bulk Waste generator are identified and 400 Bulk Waste Generator are processing their own waste.
- e) Total 700 GVPs has been identified and eliminated.
- f) Total of 861 challan of Solid Waste Management and 2248 Plastic Waste Challan are issued in the Month of June.

Thereafter the progress made in 7 model towns notified i.e. Rohtak, Karnal, Panipat, Panchkula, Fatehabad, Thanesar and Jind was reviewed and the committee found the progress satisfactory.

The SLC committee members then reviewed the progress made in Bahadurgarh for overall Solid Waste Management.

Bahadurgarh

- a) 100% door to door collection achieved in all 31 wards with 100% compartmentalized of all vehicles.
- b) 19 % source segregation i.e. 6 wards are performing source segregation and the remaining wards will initiate Source Segregation by the 31.7.2019.
- c) Total quantity of waste generated and collected is 80 TPD with the help of 166 compartmentalised vehicles.
- d) 3.5 Hectare Land is Available for processing of waste.
- e) 10 pits are constructed for wet waste processing and 20 more pits are under construction
- f) With the help of Vermicomposting 2 TPD wet waste is being processed and fertiliser is being sold in market.
- g) There is 1 MRF Facility for segregation of dry waste.
- h) 15 Bulk Waste Generators are identified out of which 1 is doing on-site composting.
- i) 30 Solid Waste Challans are issued in June 2019 and amount collected is 10900.
- j) 3 Plastic waste challan are issued and the amount collected is 2500.
- k) Total no of ragpickers identified 74 and Identity card has been issued to them.

The Chairman of the committee was directed that Rag Pickers identified must be imparted with necessary training and safety gears like Gloves, Masks, Boots etc. Also, it was suggested that regular health check of the rag pickers may be done by engaging the Red Cross Society and other means.

Additional Chief Secretary, Environment advised that information related to SWM penalty and PWM penalty should be collected in a more detailed manner covering total recovered penalty and due penalty.

The Chairperson directed that from next meeting onwards the progress made under all the waste management rules will be reviewed i.e. Solid Waste, Plastic Waste, C&D Waste, Bio-Medical Waste, E-Waste and Hazardous Waste respectively and should be kept as the agenda item. Prior notices must be issued to all the departments and operators concerned with respective rules for deputing the officer not below the rank of Deputy Director for attending the SLC meeting with updated progress report.

It was further decided that Chairman will visit Model City Karnal and review the progress made on ground on 11.07.2019.
