The meeting was held 05.11.2024 at 10:00 AM under the Chairmanship of Sh. P. Raghavendra Rao, Chairman, and HSPCB to review the implementation of the Yamuna Action Plan. The following were present:-

Right at the outset, the Chairman welcomed all the participants and briefed about the matter concerning air pollution in the case of WP NO. 13029/1985 - MC Mehta Vs UOI pending before Hon'ble Supreme Court. It was conveyed that the Hon'ble Court has taken the matter very seriously and giving very short dates. He apprehended that similar issue may arise in case of water pollution also, as lot of froth formation in river Yamuna is being reported in the media. The experts suggest various reasons for froth formation, such as presence of phosphates & ammonia in the effluents. The possible sources can be textile washing and dyeing units. The Board has received lot of complaints on NMCG Portal and X account. The action plan already submitted mostly deals with domestic sewage but visible action for industrial pollution also needs to be given. He further mentioned that the HSPCB has already started an X Account (Twitter) in compliance of Hon'ble Supreme Court directions. All officers should open their account on X and follow the Haryana_spcb. Public complaints are tagged to the HSPCB account by the CPCB/ CAQM, which are to be responded by the HSPCB mandatorily.

The Chairman further desired that the ATR for last week in case of water pollution / YAP and action to be taken for coming week be explained. After detailed discussion, the following decisions were taken:-

1. As the action taken during last week was not sufficient, the ROs need to activate SESTF and take comprehensive action against violators and also those who shield or facilitate them. The landowner details must be collected to persuade them not to allow any illegal activity.
2. All ROs should report daily to the Water Cell of the action taken against illegal disposal of effluent through tankers or illegal industries, on the following format:-

For Industries
